Disaster readiness in your area

Volunteer disaster readiness organizations in Hirakata City

Volunteer disaster readiness organizations have been formed in each of Hirakata City's 45 elementary school districts. These groups conduct training on topics such as fire extinguisher use, artificial respiration and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and AED use. They also practice tasks like processing incoming evacuees at shelters, organizing evacuation routes, establishing areas for people who are feeling ill, and assembling cardboard beds and partitions in order to prepare to operate shelters in line with anti-infection measures.

HUG (shelter operation game)

Disaster readiness training in Hirakata City incorporates a shelter operation game known as HUG. HUG lets participants experience events at shelters and

how to deal with evacuees in the form of a game.

The name comes from the Japanese words for "shelter" (hinanjo), "operation" (un'ei), and "game" (gēmu). It also means "to embrace" in English, evoking an image of shelters as places that extend a warm welcome to evacuees.

Participants place cards bearing information about evacuees (age, gender, family makeup, illnesses, etc.) on paper representing a

gymnasium or classroom being used as a shelter. They also deal with a variety of events that occur at shelters, including identifying locations for toilets and food distribution and dealing with media requests.

Helping others in a disaster and offering first aid

In past disasters, many lives have been saved by residents working together

It's important to raise awareness of the need for cooperation as residents work together to create a pleasant community while safeguarding their area from disasters.

Consider participating in activities organized by your neighborhood association to help create a brighter future for your area.

And please work with your fellow residents to ensure everyone can evacuate safely by helping people who require special consideration or assistance.

Elderly and injured or ill people

Work with others to help such people and carry them on your back in an emergency.

People with hearing disabilities

Use exaggerated mouth movements and enunciate clearly. Communicate accurate information with gestures or in writing.

People using wheelchairs



Foreigners

Use gestures to communicate and help them avoid feeling isolated and alone.



People with vision disabilities

Either place your hand lightly on the person's elbow opposite the hand holding the cane or give them your arm or shoulder and walk slowly half a step ahead while describing any obstructions such as stairs.

Work with at least one other person to help people with wheelchairs negotiate stairs. Face the wheelchair forwards when going up stairs and backwards when going down. If you're alone, use a sling or other means to carry the person to safety.



First aid

Memorize how to provide first aid for typical injuries.




Using plastic or other gloves to prevent the spread of infectious disease, exert pressure on the wound with a clean piece of gauze or handkerchief to stop bleeding. Hold the wound higher than the heart if possible.

Apply a splint to the area of the break (or use a piece of wood or an umbrella as an alternative) to immobilize it along with the joints above and below the break.



Cool the burn as soon as possible with running water. If the victim is wearing clothing, cool the burn from outside the clothing.

Apply compressions to the victim's sternum. (Strength: Compress about 5 centimeters for an adult or about 1/3 the thickness of the chest for a child.) (Speed: Use an unbroken rhythm of 100 to 120 compressions per minute.)



Press the power button to begin audio guidance (some models turn on automatically when the cover is opened). Follow the instructions to affix the pads to the right side of the chest and the left side of the abdomen to begin analyzing the victim's electrocardiogram.

Follow the instructions to affix the pads to the right side of the chest and the left side of the abdomen to begin analyzing the victim's electrocardiogram. Verify that nobody is touching the victim and press the "shock" button to energize the pads.

How to check on the safety of others

In the event of an earthquake or other disaster, it's typically difficult to get through to stricken areas by phone.

Oln general, evacuees should make their way to shelters on foot. Please avoid travel by car. OEmergency traffic routes are specified when traffic managers (the Public Safety Commission) designate routes and intervals on which to prohibit or restrict travel by general vehicles in order to facilitate the precise and smooth implementation of emergency measures in response to a disaster in accordance with Article 76 Paragraph 1 of the Basic Act on Disaster Management.
